A silent night, a star above, A blessed gift of hope and love

May the blessings of Christmas be with you now and always.

Hello from the Manse,

There was a time when you had to deal *first* with the necessity of the Christian tightrope walk of opportunities and difficulties which it is our modern 'celebration' of Halloween.

Only then, once Halloween was past, could you seriously get on with the business of complaining in church magazines about what our retailers have turned Christmas into. Now I realise things have changed. Now I realise I was wrong – indeed wrong twice over.



You are blessed indeed if you have yet to be visually mugged by the Christmas hype that avalanches us in our society. Halloween is a minor side-show, alongside the commencement of our retailer's Advent season that now appears to begin around the last week in August or the first week in September. But it wasn't just the beginning of retail/shopper Advent 'hostilies' that I got wrong. It was the source of the problem about which I was mistaken.

Over the years I have personally held everything from capitalism through to Tesco and Asda as responsible for the loss of Christmas because of the way in which it has been reduced to just an excuse for commerce. I was completely wrong. The reality is, however, much worse. Much, much worse.

You are to blame. I am to blame. If we get to the first week in January and feel we just haven't had a real Christmas it will be because our Advent wasn't real.

The heart of the human problem is indeed the problem of the human heart. Now is the time to be googling https://adventconspiracy.org/ - it's an attempt to get past the good intentions of making this year's Christmas a real Christmas.

The point is simple, however, it does ask us to take seriously the reason why so many of us don't have a fulfilling Noel season – it's because we buy too much, literally, into the retailer's version of what a real Christmas is.

I was profoundly hit by how direct the statement from the 2010 Lausanne Movement was about why we have so completely failed in our care of our planet: "love for God's creation demands that we repent of our part in the destruction, waste and pollution of the earth's resources and our collusion in the toxic idolatry of consumerism."

As we get almost a quarter of the way into the twenty-first century, it's not atheism or Islam that is Christ's primary opposition in the west – it's Christians who won't repent of this 'toxic idolatry'. It is a blasphemy before God that the



season of His Son's birth has become the time of year when clients of Christians Against Poverty feel most compelled to go into debt to do Christmas *properly*. The occasion when we remember that those who first heard of Christ's birth were shepherds is now the season when the sin of consumerism reaches its height.

We can't just smile at the irony. We can't just complain about supermarkets. We must repent; personally; sincerely; daily; and above all, we must repent in a fashion that shows in our behaviour. We do more than mark Christmas on the calendar and make sure we've got the turkey ordered.

Advent Conspiracy says we need to do four things celebrate Christmas in a genuinely Christian manner: Worship Fully; Spend Less; Give More; Love All.

That's the four points – check out the website to take it further.

If we feel Christmas just isn't the same today as it used to be we must seek to personally change until it is what it's supposed to be. The countdown has already begun.
